Dear Families of Yarra Glen PS,

This Saturday evening will be a fantastic event for the parent community of Yarra Glen Primary to get together and battle it over some Trivia. Thank you to Amy Kanally and all her team that have done a fabulous job in getting this event organised. I am sure the evening will be a great success and make the many hours that Amy has poured into this event feel worthwhile.

I wish to extend a big shout out to all the parent and community volunteers that work tirelessly for our school. All of your efforts are extremely appreciated.

This week I attended the school swimming program with Prep/ 1 O. It was great to see the success that many of the students were having in the pool.

On two evenings this week a person or persons have engaged in vandalism at our school. Both incidents have involved damage to school property and the lighting of fires. The presence of Victoria Police at the school on Wednesday directly relates to these incidents which are now subject to investigation. Nobody at the school was arrested by the police. In fact the police on site were forensics officers collecting evidence necessary to investigate and identify the perpetrators. We currently have no reason to believe anybody currently at our school was involved.

Whilst the damage in these incidents has been repairable, it has been very disruptive and in both incidents our community is lucky that the damage was not more substantial. Can I please ask that if anybody sees people acting suspiciously around our school buildings outside of school hours immediately contacts Victoria Police.

Conveyance Allowance

Financial help with student transport (conveyance allowance)

Families in rural and regional Victoria can get help with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest school or campus. This is known as the conveyance allowance.

The conveyance allowance is available to students travelling by:

- public transport
- private car
- private bus
- or to students whose nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus.

The conveyance allowance is a contribution towards transport costs and is not intended to cover the full cost of transporting children to and from school.

Who can apply

The conveyance allowance is available to families who meet certain criteria.

Students attending a school must:

- attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible;
- be enrolled at a school/campus outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary;
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended;
- be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.

Apply for the allowance

Families can complete an application form and submit it to their school. Please contact the office if you believe you meet the above criteria.

There is a "next nearest allowance" for government schools if there is no public transport available and the mode of transport is private car. It is a partial allowance and it has to be the 2nd closest government school.

Class News

In 5/6P...

The class 5/6P have been doing a range of things in Maths, Literacy, Inquiry. There will be also mentions of the Incursions we've been to so far and more about Inter School Sports. Here's what we've been doing:

Literacy: In literacy we've been learning about the reading powers, which are connecting, questioning, visualising, infer and transform. It helps the reader have a clear understanding of the text they are reading.

We are also doing Literacy Circles, where a group of people read the same book, and each person has a different job. Every Friday, the groups meet up and share what they have to say, the Discussion Director, who is the leader of the group asks questions to the others in the group to get them thinking. Literacy Circles help with forming an opinion, and it's very good to hear other people's opinions on the same topic.

5/6P are also learning about Bloom's Taxonomy, which are different types of question you can ask before reading a book, during, or after. These types of questions are Remembering, Understanding, Applying, Analysing, Evaluating and Creating. They help you to understand the text and think deeper as you're reading.

Maths: In Maths, our class have been doing a lot of problem solving, which helps when you're in the real world, and when you're older and you have to solve problems.

Mental Computation is where you can work problems out in your head, or you could think of it as mental strategies. This could be helpful when you have to work out really short problems, like multiplication problems for an example. Or addition is really good to do in your head to.

Fractions are numbers that aren't whole. For an example, $\frac{1}{2}$ is not a whole number, it is 1 half. In our class, we have been learning about how to add, subtract, multiply, and divide fractions. It may seem simple, but it's harder than you think.

Geometry is about shapes and their properties, our class have been studying the angles side of it more specifically. Angles are where 2 lines meet, after that they form an angle.


Inquiry: We have been learning about Design and Technology and Sustainability. Sustainability is about helping the environment and the relationship we have with it. Design and Technology is about building non-computer based technologies.

Inter school Sports: Inter School Sports is where 6 schools all play sport against each other. There are 3 sports to choose from, netball, volley stars, and football. Our last game will be on Friday the 7th at Coldstream Primary.

Places to visit:



Yarra Valley Railway - Healesville-Kinglake Rd, Healesville

The Lilydale to Healesville Railway line was officially opened in March 1889 and continued to operate until the line closed in 1983.

Yarra Ranges Regional Museum - Castella St, Lilydale

The Museum was opened in 2011 and features a range of exhibitions and historical artefacts significant to the Yarra Ranges.



Mt Evelyn Memorial Garden - Birmingham Rd, Mt Evelyn

A garden and war memorial that commemorates those who have served in various conflicts.

Dandenong Ranges Botanical Gardens - Falls Rd, Olinda

The gardens were established in 1960 and host an array of brilliantly coloured flowers.



O'Shannassay Aqueduct Trail - Dee Rd, Millgrove

The aqueduct was constructed between 1911 and 1914 and carried water from O'Shannassy Reservoir to Silvan Dam.

Melba Park - Market St, Lilydale

Named after the famous Dame Nellie Melba, the park has many significant features including the Melba gates and Croquet Club pavilion.



Seville Water Play Park - Monbulk-Seville Rd, Seville

The Seville Water Play park was developed from the old Seville Memorial pool which was built in 1956 by the local townspeople.

Badger Creek Weir and Park - Badger Weir Rd, Badger Creek



The weir was constructed in 1909 but became redundant when a second weir was built higher up the creek in 1929

Silvan Reservoir Park - Stonyford Rd, Silvan

Construction on the Silvan Dam began in the late 1920's with it officially opened on 7th July 1931.

Belmont Lookout Tower - Belmont Avenue, Upwey

This tower is the only surviving example of the lookouts that were scattered throughout the Dandenong Ranges.



Mont De Lancey - Wellington Rd, Wandin North

This historic house, built by Henry Seibre, a stonemason, was completed in 1862 and stayed within the family until 1993.






