Speak Nicely & No Swearing Campaign



AUDITION PROCESS

All students must attend auditions for acceptance into our programs.

Auditions occur annually on a Saturday or Sunday.

Students may apply in the course of a year and out-of-round auditions can be arranged.

FEES

Fees are calculated on an annual basis and can vary depending on the specific program undertaken and when you join the program. Annual fees for MTA begin at \$1,750. If you join at the mid year point fees are pro-rated to 55% (due to performance outcomes). All fees include weekly rehearsals, workshops and performance costumes. Payment plan options are available.

TERM INFORMATION

Classes run according to the school terms. We don't hold classes during Government school holidays.

PERFORMANCE INFORMATION

Performances are ticketed and prices range from \$30-\$45 (subject to change).

UNIFORM

All MTS performers wear the PSA shirt to rehearsals, along with black shoes and black leggings or track pants. For performances, in addition to the PSA t-shirt and black shoes, students will be required to supply black trousers/slacks. All students may opt to purchase a PSA varsity jacket which become compulsory at Senior level.






This Week at TheirCare:
