Speak Nicely Campaign

The Speak Nicely Campaign is underway and students have been encouraged to speak nicely to one another, furthermore, discouraging inappropriate comments/language with their peers. Thus far we already have 148 speak nicely green slips, not too far from our 250 goal. If and when we reach our goal this will continue to be a whole school focus.

Auslan

I am pleased to announce that we will be taking on Auslan as part of our specialist language program. This will be replacing Indonesian. There are many benefits to learning Auslan as stated in the Curriculum:

- opportunities for engagement with the Deaf community and insight into its rich cultural heritage;
- opportunities to develop intercultural capabilities, understanding and respect for others, appreciation of diversity and openness to different perspectives and experiences.

What is Auslan?

Auslan is **Australian Sign Language**, the native language of the Australian Deaf community, and is a visual-spatial, natural language with its own grammar and vocabulary. Auslan has linguistic elements, such as hand shapes (including orientation, location, and movement), non-manual features (including eye gaze, facial expressions, arm, head and body postures) and fingerspelling.

Auslan also has its own grammar, which is different from English. Auslan grammar is composed of precise hand shapes, facial expressions and body movements that convey concrete and abstract information.

Benefits of learning Auslan and incorporating Auslan into the school program has many benefits for both deaf and hearing children.



Sign language can:

- enhance children's educational and personal development;
- increase memory retention and motion processing;



- stimulate brain development and mental flexibility; and
- increase enjoyment in communicating for both hearing and deaf children.

Task Works P-2 Incursion

Students in P-2 learnt a lot at their Task Works incursion. They learnt the way that an object moves depends on a variety of factors, including their size and shape and how a push or a pull affects how an object moves or changes shape. They also explored how technologies use forces to create movement in products.

It was a pleasure to have Luke Kennedy present and speak to our students, staff and parents. A bit about "Wigs for Kids"

Mission - Helping Children Look Themselves and Live Their Lives!

The various causes of hair loss in children don't result in just physical suffering. The change in their appearance can drastically undermine their self-image and sabotage their self-esteem. To help heal the pain of these struggles, Certified Cosmetic Therapist Jeffrey Paul founded Wigs For Kids, a non-profit hair donation organization that has been serving children suffering from hair loss since 1981.

Wigs For Kids is a cooperative effort among Certified Service Providers throughout North America who share a common goal. "Children shouldn't have to worry about how they look, especially when they're in the middle of a health crisis," says Jeffrey Paul. "We want to give these kids the opportunity to feel good about themselves again."

The cost of the hair replacement systems Wigs For Kids provides is approximately \$1,800. "These are custom-made hair replacements," says Jeffrey Paul. "Each prosthesis is hand-tied and is made completely from human hair. We make sure they look just like a child's own hair."

"They won't come off on the baseball field or in the playground," he adds. "Kids can count on them. And because kids look just the way they did before, they feel better about themselves. They look in the mirror and their eyes light up. To see that light in their eyes – that's priceless."





How did it start?

The Kids of Gold camp began in Feb 2003 with the co-operation and backing of a number of Primary Schools. Parents and children were so enthusiastic about the camp, it developed a 2nd level, then a 3rd. Eight years ago a 4th level began with the aim of teaching leadership to Level 3 campers. Since then a number of leaders have come out of Level 4, and serve currently in the camps. Gary Parsons, a fully qualified teacher, with the original vision, continues with a team of others working in the camps.

What do they do?

The central theme of the camp is "You are Special" and will enable every child to see how special they really are!

Activities will include sessions about value, confidence and self-esteem and include group and individual outdoor rope and initiative activities with trained staff.
