#### **Grant News**

Yarra Glen Primary School is delighted that the Minister for Veterans' Affairs/Minister for Defence Personnel ~ Hon Matt Keogh ~ has approved a grant of \$2000 for us to install new flagpoles, to proudly fly the Aboriginal Flag and Torres Strait Islander Flag.

While we do currently have these flags on display in the PERRI Centre, the addition of two new flagpoles will allow us to also display the flags in the outdoor assembly area alongside the Australian National Flag.

- At least 3000 Aboriginal and 850 Torres Strait Islander people served in WWII
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have participated in all military conflicts since the World Wars, including Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan.

Yarra Glen Primary School appreciates the Saluting Their Service Commemorative Grants Program, for providing us the funds to display the Aboriginal Flag and Torres Strait Islander Flag daily, including days of commemoration.





#### Emergency Management Drill – Off-site to Mackenzie Reserve

On 14th March (after lunch) we will be actioning our annual off-site Emergency Management (EM) drill to Mackenzie Reserve. Generally, EM drills need to be unprompted, however, given the nature of the drill, requires planning and to ensure all students are emotionally prepared.

#### **2024 NAPLAN**

In the next few weeks, students in Grade 3 and Grade 5 will preparing and will complete NAPLAN testing. The testing schedule is:

- Wednesday 13th March 9.00 am 11.00 am (Writing)
- Thursday 14th March 9.00 am 11.00 am (Reading)
- Friday 15th March 9.00 am 11.00 am (Conventions of Language)
- Tuesday 19th March 9.00 am 11.00 am (Numeracy) & 11.45 am-1.45 pm (catch-up testing)

NAPLAN stands for National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy and there is no doubt that if you follow the media, you will read, see and hear lots of different opinions around the positives and/or negatives of NAPLAN.

At Yarra Glen Primary School, we believe that NAPLAN tests are important in that they complement our existing range of school-based assessments. NAPLAN tests provide point-in-time information in relation to student performance in literacy and numeracy only. They are NOT intended to be pass/fail type tests.

As always, it is important that students come prepared to try their best, but they should not be overwhelmed by the experience. Whilst we have spent some time this term familiarising students with the formats of the tests, we believe that an excellent, engaging and rigorous teaching and learning program provides the best opportunity for success. It's great to see lots of kids playing with the guinea pigs and enjoying having our chickens back.


## SCHOOL-WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT

#### Did You Know?


There are seven seasons of the Kulin people. We have entered the luk (Eel) Season in March. The hot winds have ended and the temperature starts to get cooler. The days and nights are at equal length.

#### Seasons in the Sky

As the eels migrate, Canopus, Lo-an-tukka, the second brightest star in the sky is seen at its highest position at due South.

#### The land and animals

During this season plants such as Binap (Manna Gum) are flowering and the luk (eels) are getting fat and ready to catch.

#### **Conveyance Allowance Program**

The conveyance allowance is a form of financial assistance for parents/carers to transport children to and from school in rural and regional Victoria. In some locations, students are unable to access free school buses. In these instances, students may receive a conveyance allowance to assist with travel costs. Allowances are available for public transport, private car and private bus.

#### Eligibility for students attending a non-government school

The eligibility criteria include the requirement that a student attending a non-government school is attending the nearest appropriate school (that is 4.8km or more from the student's residence). Parents who feel they may qualify for this financial support are encouraged to click on the links below or contact the office to obtain further information regarding Conveyance Allowance.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

## CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- · \$250 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family dircumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
